HU PECS01:

- Selection process: the partner university is kindly requested to ensure that the language proficiency of the outgoing student(s) is a minimum B2.

- Services for incoming students:
 - Orientation Day is organized for international students each semester where students get information about the university in general, administrative issues, student activities, the Hungarian language course, and other services.
 - The ESN mentor system ensures the acculturation of foreign students by organizing a series of cultural and leisure activities.
 - Hungarian language (and culture) courses are offered for incoming students during the semesters
- For the implementation of STA/STT-mobilities, a letter of invitation – issued by an UP contact person – is required.

PL TORUN01:

- Erasmus students interested in writing a final BA-/MA-/PhD-thesis at NCU should ask a respective coordinator to get an approval to do so. Final theses need to be graded by the home institution/not by NCU.

PL TORUN01:

Partner institutions should send their nominations by email (pls. give student's first and family name, e-mail, area of studies and semester of Erasmus scholarship).

Students should apply according to the procedure given on www.umk.pl/en/cooperation/erasmus/students/application

2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 4 weeks.
3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 4 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI, given that the transcript form and all relevant course work documents have been submitted by the student.
4. Termination or modification of the agreement

The inter-institutional agreement may be terminated by either party. The agreement will remain in effect until one party notifies the other of its wish to terminate. This

should be done in writing, and a notice of at least one academic year should be given. In the event of such notice being given, all existing commitments to staff or students will be fulfilled. The agreement can be cancelled activities can be added to it, and changes in mobility data can be made annually provided they are communicated before January 1.

Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

F. Information

1. Grading systems of the institutions

HU PECS01

Code of Studies and Examinations: Section 48. (1) Assessment of student performance can be carried out according to:

- a) a five-grade scale: excellent (5), good (4), satisfactory (3), pass (2), fail (1),
- b) a three-grade scale: excellent (5), satisfactory (3), fail (1). (2)¹⁶² The student shall not earn credit points in case his/her performance is assessed by fail (1) in the five-grade scale and fail (1) in the three-grade scale, further, if the performance of the student could not be assessed and in the academic records the note 'not completed' is registered

PL TORUN01:

The Nicolaus Copernicus University follows the ECTS scheme, which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS, 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload); normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).

The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst.

Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and -. Each of them equals half a point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain *zal.* or *zaliczenie* (EN. 'pass') which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.


