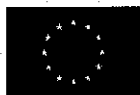

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2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 2 weeks (E VIC01),The receiving institution will send its decision within 6 weeks. (PL TORUN01).
3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks (E VIC01), (PL TORUN01) after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
4. Termination of the agreement

In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1.

Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.



F. Information

1. Grading systems of the institutions

E VIC01

Evaluation criteria at UVic are based on a 0 to 10 point system. The best mark would be equal to 10 and the lowest mark would correspond to 0. The following table may be used for comparison with other evaluation systems:

UVic	ECTS	According to ECTS grading scale
9,5 - 10	A	EXCELLENT: a particularly outstanding achievement, with only minor errors
9 - 9,4	A	
8,5 - 8,9	B	VERY GOOD: an achievement that lies above the average but with some errors
8 - 8,4	B	
7,5 - 7,9	B	
7 - 7,4	C	GOOD: an achievement that surpasses the average standard with a number of notable errors
6,5 - 6,9	C	
6 - 6,4	D	SATISFACTORY: an achievement that fulfills the average standard but with significant shortcomings
5,5 - 5,9	E	SUFFICIENT: an achievement that fulfills the average standard, despite deficiencies. Some more work required before the credit can be awarded.
5 - 5,4	E	
4,1 - 4,9	FX	FAIL: an achievement that suffers considerably from deficiencies. Some more work required before the credit can be awarded.
< 4	F	FAIL: indescribably bad performance, total absence or failure to take any exams or do any work. Considerable further work is required.

PL TORUN01:

The Nicolaus Copernicus University follows the ECTS scheme, which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS, 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload); normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).



The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst.

Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and -. Each of them equals half a point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain zal. or zaliczenie (EN. 'pass') which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.
