DK AARHUS01:

All applicants must document English language qualifications comparable to a Danish B level in English (CEFR C1, TOEFL IBT 83, IELT S 6.5). English language qualifications can be documented as follows: <u>TOEFL test</u>, <u>IELTS</u> (<u>academic</u>) test, "C1 level" obtained by examination from a <u>CEFR</u>-validated English language course. Exempted from this rule are applicants with a completed English-taught entrance examination (high school) or

Exempted from this rule are applicants with a completed English-taught entrance examination (high school) or an English-taught Bachelor's programme. Applicants with a Danish/Nordic entrance examination (high school) or International Baccalaureate (high school) with an English level comparable to a Danish B level in English

Partner institutions should send their nominations by email (pls. give student's first and family name, e-mail, area of studies and semester of Erasmus scholarship).

Students should apply according to the procedure given on http://www.umk.pl/en/cooperation/erasmus/students/application
The online application should be submitted by the students by the **1**st **of June** or **1**st **of November**.

- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within six weeks.
- **3.** A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than five weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- 4. Termination of the agreement

The agreement will become operative on the date of signature of both universities and shall remain in force for a period of **7** years. In case of the termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be sent to the partner university. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

The Nicolaus Copernicus University follows the ECTS scheme, which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS, 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload); normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).

The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst.

Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and -. Each of them equals half a point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain zal. or zaliczenie (EN. 'pass') which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.

Visa

The sending and receiving institutions will provide assistance, when required, in securing visas for incoming and outbound mobile participants, according to the requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education.
