1. The incoming Erasmus students/partner universities can check information about extension of the study period and changes to the original Training agreement on the web-site page: www.unjud.it/international-area/incoming-mobility

Students are required to provide a firefighting course certification and basic safety requirements certifications (first aid or Basic Life Support, mobilization strategies to prevent low back pain, individual protection devices' use). 2. I UDINE01 will send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by e-mail. It cannot be guaranteed another modality to nominate Erasmus students from I UDINE01 (such as online nominations etc.).

3. Partner Universities have to send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by e-mail (to iss@uniud.it). It cannot be guaranteed the acceptance of another modality to nominate Erasmus students by partner Universities (such as online nominations etc.).

4. I UDINEO1 will send its decision (information package) within 8 weeks at the maximum from the

reception of the nomination letter.

- 5. Erasmus incoming student at the I UDINE01 has to collect the Transcript of Records before leaving Udine, otherwise the Transcript of Records will be issued and sent by the I UDINE01 no later than 5 weeks directly to the personal post address of the student.
- 6. Termination or modification of the agreement:

A unilateral decision to discontinue or to change the exchanges notified to the other party by April of each year will only take effect from the September of the following new academic year.

- 1. Partner institutions should send their nominations by email (pls. give student's first and family name, e-mail, area of studies and semester of Erasmus scholarship). Students should apply according to the procedure given on http://www.unik.pl/en/cooperation/erasmus/students/application
- 2. The online application should be submitted by the students by the 1st of June or the 1st of November.
- 3. The receiving institution will send its decision within 6 weeks.
- 4. Transcript of Records

A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI, given that the transcript form and all relevant course work documents have been submitted by the student.

· Termination of the agreement

The inter-institutional agreement may be amended by mutual agreement. The inter-institutional agreement may be terminated by either party. In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. In the event of such notice being given, all existing commitments to staff or students will be fulfilled. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

ECTS Credits: The Nicolaus Copernicus University follows the ECTS scheme, which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS, 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload); normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).

The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark

Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and -. Each of them equals half a and 2 is the worst. point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain zal. or zaliczenie (EN. 'pass') which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.
