P COIMBRA01:

Master students need to send a bachelor certificate OR a transcript of records with 180 ECTS credits to the Student Exchange Office.

PhD students need to send a master certificate to the Student Exchange Office. PhD students will only receive ECTS credits if they complete courses at the host institution. Therefore, they will not receive any ECTS credits from the host institution for PhD-related research they undertake. The home institution is responsible for accrediting PhD students with ECTS credits for research completed at the host institution.

It is not possible for students to hand-in their final BA-/MA-/PhD-thesis at the host institution. Final theses need to be graded by the home institution.

The University of Coimbra offers counseling for students with disabilities and chronic diseases. We assist with finding suitable accommodation (wheelchair users are advised to apply for accommodation as early as possible), we provide information about public

transport, access to health care, and about financial support in case of additional disability expenditure on the part of the student. 4. Termination of the agreement

This agreement shall remain in force until the end of the Programme (2020/21). However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

1. Grading systems of the institutions

Grading scheme and, if available, grade distribution guidance

- 1. The final assessment of a course unit is expressed by a grade on a scale of whole numbers from 0 to 20, with 10 as the minimum passing grade, as well as its European equivalent rating.
- 2. The final classification is expressed in the range 10-20 on a numerical scale from 0 to 20, as well as its European equivalent of comparability of classification. The final grade is calculated using the weighted average number of ECTS for each outcome eligible for approval for the determination of graduation.
- 3. The final classification can be accompanied by a qualitative definition on the following scale: Sufficient (10-12), Satisfactory (12-13), Good (14-15), Very Good (16 and 17), excellent (18-20).
- 4. The scale is based on the ECTS association of a numerical definition (percentile) with the levels A, B, C, D and E, according to the following table

The classification scale ECTS is based on the distribution of results obtained in the range 10-20 for all students in a course or in the final course corresponding to the three academic years prior to the result given a minimum of 30 successful students or graduates. Where it is not possible to obtain the minimum number of elements in the distribution are considered the four, or five school years prior to distribution to complete at least 30 elements. In distribution of results are only considered grades for evaluation.

PL TORUN01:

The Nicolaus Copernicus University follows the ECTS scheme, which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS, 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload); normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).

The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst.

Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and -. Each of them equals half a point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain *zal.* or *zaliczenie* (EN. 'pass') which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.
