- Application documents received after application deadlines will not be accepted.
- In case, if the application documents aren't in Latvian, English, German or Russian language, the applicants have to add the authorized translation of these documents.
- Exchange studies for PhD students are organized according to individual plans.
- It is not possible for exchange students to defend their BA/MA/PhD thesis at the host university,
- Incoming international staff members should apply for visits to the departmental coordinators of the respective faculty (<a href="http://www.lu.lv/eng/istudents/exchange/coordinators/">http://www.lu.lv/eng/istudents/exchange/coordinators/</a>) with copy sent to the International Relations department (<a href="mailto:ad@lu.lv">ad@lu.lv</a>) of the University of Latvia.
- Applicants with special needs will be contacted before the final approval of the acceptance. Final decision depends on extra services / facilities available.

- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within LV RIGA 01 6 weeks, PL TORUN01 5 weeks.
- A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the student passed all exams and submitted the Study Records Sheet to the International Office at the receiving HEI.
- 4. Termination of the agreement

In case of earlier unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 June of year N will only take effect as of 1 September of year N+1. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

#### F. Information

#### 1. Grading systems of the institutions:

### PL TORUNO1:

The Nicolaus Copernicus University follows the ECTS scheme, which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS, 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload); normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).

The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst.

Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and -. Each of them equals half a point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain zal. or zaliczenie (EN. 'pass') which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.
