The study field of the Erasmus Agreement is binding: please nominate students attending a study programme which is coherent with the study code of the Bilateral Agreement.

The bilateral agreement specifies the number of places available, it is not possible to split the duration of each mobility to increase the number of exchanges (for example if an agreement foreseen 2 students for 10 months, it is not possible to nominate 4 students for 5 months).

Students' applications must be submitted online as soon as they receive the acceptance message with the instructions.

- I BOLOGNA01 will send its decision about acceptance to nominated students within five weeks upon receipt of nominations.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by I BOLOGNA01 no later than five weeks after student departure.

PL TORUN01:

Partner institutions should send their nominations by email (pls. give student's first and family name, email, area of studies and semester of Erasmus scholarship).

Students should apply according to the procedure given on http://www.umk.pl/en/cooperation/erasmus/students/application

The online application should be submitted by the students by the 1st of June or 1st of November.

2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 6 weeks.

Transcript of Records

A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI, given that the transcript form and all relevant course work documents have been submitted by the student.

Termination of the agreement

This agreement shall become effective from the academic year [2017/18 and shall remain in effect until the academic year [2020/21]. The contracting institutions will review the exchange annually in order to maintain a balance in number of students exchanged. However, any exchange in progress will continue until completed. In ,case of changes, the partners can amend the agreement and/or the attached info sheet data, which form an integral part of the agreement, at one academic year written notice, by sending an email to the institutional contact listed in part A. This means that a unilateral decision to modify the agreement must be notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX but it will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. Only in case of change of part B the drawing up/stipulation of a new agreement is required. The agreement may be terminated by either side at one academic year written notice by sending an email to the institutional contact. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges must be notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX but it will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The participants already nominated by their home university at the date of notice shall be permitted to complete the program. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict. The effective implementation of this agreement is subject to the award of the Erasmus University Charter to each of the participant institutions. Failure to secure a valid Charter by one or both institution shall result in automatic termination of the agreement.

1. Grading systems of the institutions

I BOLOGNA01

PL TORUNO1:

The Nicolaus Copernicus University follows the ECTS scheme, which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS, 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload); normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).

The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst.

Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and -. Each of them equals half a point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain *zal.* or *zaliczenie* (EN. 'pass') which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.
