Students applying for an Erasmus at NCU should meet the following language requirements: B2 of English (both in writing and speaking). Students should present a language certificate proving their language competences. We accept official proficiency language certificates or "internal" University proficiency tests (certified by a Language Teacher at the Sending Institution - you can download Language proficiency form from here http://www.umk.pl/en/erasmus/downloads/Lg requirements Erasmus plus.pdf). Important! Confirmations by private teachers are not valid.

** All courses within the School of Social and Political Sciences (ISCSP) are taught in Portuguese. Although we recommend that incoming students have some Portuguese language competence on arrival, we accept students who are beginners. There are Portuguese intensive language courses at beginner and intermediate levels available for Erasmus students at our School.

- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 6 weeks, **PL TORUN01** 5 weeks.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the student passed all exams and submitted the Study Records Sheet to the International Office at the receiving HEI.
- 4. Termination of the agreement

In case of earlier unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 June of year N will only take effect as of 1 September of year N+1.Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

F. Information

1. Grading systems of the institutions:

PL TORUN01:

The Nicolaus Copernicus University follows the ECTS scheme, which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS, 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload); normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).

The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst.

Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and -. Each of them equals half a point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain *zal.* or *zaliczenie* (EN. 'pass') which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.

To pass an exam, the student has to achieve a mark from 10 to 20. In considered: **0-9** (fail), **10-11** (sufficient), **12-13** (satisfactory), **14-16** (good), **17-18** (very good) and **19-20** (excellent).
