G ATHINEO1: Courses at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens are normally taught in Greek. As not all incoming students are fluent in Greek at the beginning of their study, the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens requires good knowledge (Level B2) of the English language to allow students to communicate and function within an academic context.

However, there are courses in other languages too, especially at the Foreign Language Departments and the Department of Law (courses in English, French and German language). The Department of Economics and the Department of Communication and Media Studies offer some courses in English too. A few postgraduate courses are also taught in other languages (mainly in English). In all other Departments there are special arrangements for Erasmus+ students. The most common one is the assignment of essays in English with the use of English bibliography.

Modern Greek language courses are offered free of charge to Erasmus students who are registered at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens by the Modern Greek Language Teaching Centre. Courses are offered in both winter and spring semester (6 hours/week). Students that succeed in the examinations at the end of each semester obtain 6 ECTS credits. - 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- 4. Termination of the agreement: Termination of this agreement or changes in the data set above can be amended annually, if communicated before December 1st. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

PL TORUNO1:

Partner institutions should send their nominations by email (pls. give student's first and family name, e-mail, area of studies and semester of Erasmus scholarship).

The online application should be submitted by the students by the 1st of June or 1st of November.

2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 6 weeks.

Transcript of Records

A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI, given that the transcript form and all relevant course work documents have been submitted by the student.

Termination of the agreement

The inter-institutional agreement may be amended by mutual agreement. The inter-institutional agreement may be terminated by either party. In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. In the event of such notice being given, all existing

commitments to staff or students will be fulfilled. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

F. Information

1. Grading systems of the institutions

G ATHINEO1: The grading scale runs from 0 to 10. Passing grades are from 5 to 10: 5-6 = GOOD, 7-8 = VERY GOOD, 9-10= EXCELLENT.

PL TORUNG1:

The Nicolaus Copernicus University follows the ECTS scheme, which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS, 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload); normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).

The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst.

Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and -. Each of them equals half a point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain zal. or zaliczenie (EN. 'pass') which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.
