#### D. Additional requirements

#### P LISBOA03:

 The academic year at NOVA FCSH usually runs from September to January (1st semester) and from February to June (2nd semester).

The period of student mobility can only be testified according to our academic calendar: maximum of 4 or 5 months for one semester and 9 months for full academic year.

- NOVA FCSH organizes biannual courses of Portuguese Language and Culture for foreigners.
   Attendance is strongly recommended and at no cost for all incoming students of NOVA FCSH.
- Exchange students at NOVA FCSH can sign up for a maximum of 30 ECTS per semester (plus 4
  ECTS for the Portuguese Language Course) and must attend at least one course per semester
  in one of the Departments that have the Erasmus+ Agreement with the partner university. The
  remaining courses can be chosen among our entire academic offer.

#### PL TORUN01:

The Nicolaus Copernicus University follows the ECTS scheme, which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS, 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload); normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).

The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst.

Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and -. Each of them equals half a point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain *zal.* or *zaliczenie* (EN. 'pass') which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.
