- 3. A Transcript of Records/Transcript of Works will be issued by the receiving institution no later than **4 weeks** after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.

4. Termination of the agreement

This agreement shall become effective in the academic year [2020/21]. In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year must be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20xx will only take effect as of 1 September 20xx+1. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.
