Students should present a language certificate proving their language competences. We accept official proficiency language certificates or "internal" University proficiency tests (certified by a Language Teacher at the Sending Institution - you can download Language proficiency form from here: http://www.umk.pl/en/erasmus/downloads/Lg_requirements_Erasmus_plus.pdf). Important! Confirmations by private teachers are not valid.

2. The receiving institution will send its decision within six weeks.
3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than five weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
4. Termination of the agreement

The agreement will become operative on the date of signature of both universities and shall remain in force for a period of 6 years. In case of the termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be sent to the partner university. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

F. Information

1. Grading systems of the institutions

PL_TORUN01:

The Nicolaus Copernicus University follows the ECTS scheme, which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS, 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload), normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).

The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst.

Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and -. Each of them equals half a point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain za/, or Zaliczenie (EN, 'pass') which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.


2. Visa


